

INTRODUCTION TO THE READINGS THIS WEEKEND

First Reading:

Security can be more attractive than freedom, and the Chosen People often complained that while they were in captivity, they at least knew where their food and drink was coming from. They had to learn to depend on God.

Second Reading:

Paul insists that what proves God's love for us is that Christ died for us while we were sinners. In this, Paul is being autobiographical: he was overtaken by God's love while he was engaged in persecuting Christians. It was a reflection on God's mercy towards himself that motivated Paul to keep proclaiming the Gospel of mercy to others.

Gospel:

This long Gospel reading is a gradual getting -to-know you, in which on outcast, jaded, cynical woman comes to recognise Christ as her Saviour and the Saviour of the world.
